

BRINSLEY PARISH COUNCIL WEBSITE ACCESSIBILITY STATEMENT

Brinsley Parish Council recognises the importance of accessibility for all users to its published media. It has engaged the services of Parish Online to provide the platform for its website and they have ensured that the requirements set down for Parish Councils is achieved and wherever possible exceeded.

Parish Online publish their statement on the parish council website.

In addition to the Parish Online statement the Council engaged a specialist website developer to undertake an independent review in June 2026 and they confirmed the high standard of tools and structure in place to deliver the best possible service. Their findings are attached.

As part of this procedure a number of content related issues were raised and these will be addressed as part of a wider re-structuring of content during the 26/27 year.

The Council invite and appreciate feedback on the data that it presents to its users and any issues should be reported to the Clerk who will endeavour to make available or supply the data requested and revisit/amend this policy accordingly.

Nice To Haves:

However there are a couple of bits on the page that could be improved as general “good practice”.

Notes to consider:

1. The alt text for a lot of the images is simply “placeholder image”. Make these more specific, ie. “placeholder image for Cllr Rebekah Rainbow” to allow for easier navigation and readability, in case the images fail to load.
2. It is better to have the full card be a link, rather than having two links on the same card going to the same place. Eg. The picture below and the Vacancy Notice link to the same age when clicked, however they are treated as two separate links, which is a bit redundant. Can just have one link surround the image and text to reduce duplication.
